Interpretation of the Parable

The seed is the word of the kingdom. The wayside soil is the hardened hearer. The shallow soil is the unstable hearer. The thorny ground is the hearer who permits other things to choke out the word. The good ground is the faithful hearer who bears fruit. The birds of the air are the evil one. The sun's heat is tribulation and persecution. The thorns are the cares, riches, and pleasures of life. The various multiples of yield are the variable fruitfulness of hearers. The sudden sprouting of seed on shallow soil stands for the ease with which unstable souls are converted.

The sower stands for God.

Coffman's Comments on Matthew 5:1 – Teachers Sat Down

Note the custom of sitting down to teach, a procedure that was long followed in the early church. Sitting to teach was an indication of authority. Dummelow noted that in the "early church, the preacher sat, and the congregation, including the emperor, stood." Most of the cathedrals of Europe are still without pews or other seating facilities for the congregation. The reformer, Martin Luther, alluded to this custom when he said, objecting to the Pope's remaining seated to observe the Lord's Supper, "Let him stand up when he takes the communion, like any other stinking sinner."
