Theophilus

- *Means "friend of God," or "lover of God"
- *Some content that he adopted this name to indicate any believer in Christ. *Unlikely*

Sabbath Day's Journey

The Mishnah indicates that travel on the Sabbath was limited to 2000 cubits (Sotah 5:3), which would be approx. 1,100 meters. This journey from the Mount of Olives back to Jerusalem was about 2/3 of a mile.

Sabbath Day's Journey

It is impossible to say 1000 cubits, for it already said 2000 cubits, and it is impossible to say 2000 cubits, for it already said 1000 cubits. How does it work? One-thousand cubits is for the open land, and 2000 cubits is the Sabbath border [the distance one can travel from the city on Sabbath]." Rabbi Eliezer, son of Rabbi Yosi the Galilian says, 1000 cubits is for the open land, and 2000 cubits is for fields and orchards.

And he kissed him.

Mark 14:43-45 (ESV)

⁴³ And immediately, while he was still speaking, Judas came, one of the twelve, and with him a crowd with swords and clubs, from the chief priests and the scribes and the elders. ⁴⁴ Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying, "The one I will kiss is the man. Seize him and lead him away under guard." ⁴⁵ And when he came, he went up to him at once and said, "Rabbi!" And he kissed him.

Luke 22:47-48 (ESV)

⁴⁷ While he was still speaking, there came a crowd, and the man called Judas, one of the twelve, was leading them. He drew near to Jesus to kiss him, ⁴⁸ but Jesus said to him, "Judas, would you betray the Son of Man with a kiss?"

John 18:2-3 (ESV)

² Now Judas, who betrayed him, also knew the place, for Jesus often met there with his disciples. ³ So Judas, having procured a band of soldiers and some officers from the chief priests and the Pharisees, went there with lanterns and torches and weapons.

Death of Judas

Matthew 27:3-10 (ESV)

³ Then when Judas, his betrayer, saw that Jesus was condemned, he changed his mind and brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and the elders, ⁴ saying, "I have sinned by betraying innocent blood." They said, "What is that to us? See to it yourself." ⁵ And throwing down the pieces of silver into the temple, he departed, and he went and hanged himself. ⁶ But the chief priests, taking the pieces of silver, said, "It is not lawful to put them into the treasury, since it is blood money." ⁷ So they took counsel and bought with them the potter's field as a burial place for strangers. ⁸ Therefore that field has been called the Field of Blood to this day. ⁹ Then was fulfilled what had been spoken by the prophet Jeremiah, saying, "And they took the thirty pieces of silver, the price of him on whom a price had been set by some of the sons of Israel, ¹⁰ and they gave them for the potter's field, as the Lord directed me."
