Why was the law given?

-To bring knowledge of sin (v.7, Rom 5:20; Gal 3:19)

-So the promise of salvation by faith in Christ might be given to those who believe (v. Gal 3:22)...HOW?

Paul is still dealing with the questions that he posed in Rom 6:1 & 15

¹**Or** do you not know, brothers—for I am speaking to those who know the law—that the law is binding on a person only as long as he lives?

²For a married woman is bound by law to her husband while he lives, but if her husband **dies** she is released from the law of marriage.

³Accordingly, she will be called an adulteress if she lives with another man while her husband is alive. But if her husband **dies**, she is free from that law, and if she marries another man she is not an adulteress.

⁴**Likewise**, my brothers, you also have **died to the law through the body of Christ**, so that you may **belong to another**, to him who has been raised from the dead, in order that we may bear **fruit for God**.

⁵For while we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the law, were at work in our members to bear **fruit for death**.

⁶But now we are **released from the law**, having **died** to that which held us captive, so that we **serve in the new way of the Spirit** and not in the old way of the written code.

⁷**What then shall we say? That the law is sin? By no means!** Yet if it had not been for the law, I would not have known **sin**. For I would not have known what it is to covet if the law had not said, "**You shall not covet.**"

⁸But **sin**, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, produced in me all kinds of covetousness. For apart from the law, **sin lies dead**.

⁹I was **once alive** apart from the law, but when the commandment came, **sin came alive** and **I died**.

¹⁰The very commandment that promised life proved to be **death** to me.

¹¹For **sin**, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, deceived me and through it **killed me**.

¹²So the law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.

¹³Did that which is good, then, bring **death** to me? By no means! It was **sin**, producing **death** in me through what is good, **in order that sin might be shown to be sin**, and through the commandment might become **sinful** beyond measure.

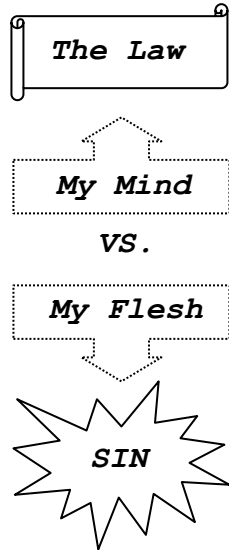

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Romans Chapter 7 - Questions for Discussion

Memory Verse:

Romans 7:18 (ESV)

¹⁸ For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out.

Is Paul trying to make a specific point about marriage? If yes, what is his point? If no, why does he introduce marriage into this discussion? (vv. 1-3)

What is involved in “dying to the law” or being “released from the law?” What is the benefit to us? What would be the ending result if we did not “die to the law?” What does it mean that our sinful passions are “aroused by the law?” (vv. 4-6; Gal 2:19-20; Rom 3:20)

Does “released from the law” imply that we are no longer expected to keep God’s commandments? Why or why not? (vv. 4-6; II Cor 5:14-15; Gal 5:16-24; Titus 3:8)

What does God’s law do for us (what benefit does Paul point out)? In what sense is sin dead without the law? In what sense was Paul alive apart from the law? What is the significance of Paul stating that he “died” (v. 9) or that he was “killed” when the commandments came (v. 11)? (vv. 7-11; Matt 19:16-20; Phil 3:6)

What brings death under the law? SIN Or LAW (vv. 9, 13)

What two laws are at war within the life of man? How does Paul describe this struggle in his life? How does he describe his mind? His flesh? (vv. 14-25)

How can one escape the consequences of our imperfect nature?

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Notes

As already observed, sin and death in their correlation have occupied Paul to a great degree from 5:12 on, with an occasional reference to a third element, the law. In chapter 6 he has sought to explain that the believer's crucifixion with Christ has brought freedom from enslavement to sin's dominion. Since the law has served to promote sin (5:20), it is expedient now to show that Christ's death, which involved the death of those who are his, effected release from the law also. At the same time Paul is careful to indicate that this emancipation from the law is in order to permit a new attachment, namely, to the risen Lord and his Spirit, so that from this union might flow a fruitfulness of life unattainable under the law. Since union with Christ has already been shown to be so powerful a factor in its intended result as to warrant the figure of slavery (to righteousness), the way has been made clear to teach deliverance from the law as not opening the door to irresponsible and sinful conduct.¹

We are Under a Curse

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Crucified with Christ

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The Rest of the Story

Illustration: When I look for ways to present a section of scripture, I always start looking for ways to break down the text into a way that can be more easily communicated and absorbed. I look for the main ideas, key words, points, etc.

Not doing this would be like trying to carry everything we need for a trip without luggage. The main ideas, key words, points become the “handles” that allow us to carry the full contents of what is presented in scripture.

When I look Romans 7:14-25, I see two things:

- (1) The main idea is: Mind vs. Flesh
- (2) The key word is: “**But**” >> Unusual key word!

“**But**” - 1254 δέ (*de*): pt. and cj.; ≡ Str 1161—1. LN 89.94 **and**, a marker of an addition, sometimes implying a contrast (Tit 1:1); 2. LN 89.87 **and then**, a marker of closely related events (Mt 1:2); 3. LN 89.124 **but**, a marker of contrast (Mt 22:14; Jn 7:10); 4. LN 91.4 νυνὶ δέ (*nyni de*), and so, but now; a marker of a summary statement (1Co 13:13)²

(I) But I

Illustration: The Rest of the Story was a Monday-through-Friday [radio](#) program originally hosted by [Paul Harvey](#). Beginning as a part of his newscasts during the [Second World War](#) and then premiering as its own series on the [ABC Radio Networks](#) on May 10, 1976, *The Rest of the Story* consisted of stories presented as little-known or forgotten facts on a variety of subjects with some key element of the story (usually the name of some well-known person) held back until the end. The broadcasts always concluded with a variation on the tag line “And now you know the rest of the story.”

From its inception, the scripts for the series had been drafted and the broadcasts produced by Harvey's son [Paul Harvey, Jr.](#), who in later years of his father's career also acted as a substitute host. Some of the radio stories were published in book form as *The Rest of the Story and More of The Rest of the Story*. (On the back cover of *More of the Rest of the Story*, the book is said to contain “True mysteries from history”.) After the elder Harvey's death on February 28, 2009, ABC radio host [Doug Limerick](#) was chosen as the show's new host.¹

The Rest of the Story was canceled after three weeks with Limerick as host.³

You know what the news is, but in a minute you are going to know “*The Rest of the Story*”

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Example: Andrew Jackson

(1781) Elizabeth Hutchinson who bravely marched into a British prison camp alone and petitioned the guard and commander over and over for the release of her two sons. She successfully won their release, but not in time for her oldest to be saved from infection and disease. However the youngest one lived (he was 14 years old). Harvey conveniently left out the name of the youngest, and at the end revealed that Elizabeth was actually Elizabeth Hutchinson Jackson, and that her youngest son would go on to be the 7th President of the United States, Andrew Jackson. And now you know “The Rest of the Story.”

Keyword – “But” > Paul’s “Rest of the Story”

This word appears 8 times in vv. 14-25, and highlights the contrast between what Paul’s mind wants him to do, and what his flesh compels him to do:

v. 14 For we know that the law is spiritual,	but	I am of the flesh, sold under sin.
v. 15 For I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want,	but	I am doing the very thing I hate.

²⁸ Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.”

No matter what **Our** story is, **The Rest of the Story** is always Sin, Death, Separation from God! It means NOTHING!

Without God, **The Rest of the Story** is the **END OF THE STORY!** Sentenced to death because of our sin, separated from God.

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(II) But God

BUT...it doesn't have to be the END OF THE STORY! God has offered us rescue from certain death!

Ephesians 2:1 (ESV)

¹ And you were dead in the trespasses and sins

Ephesians 2:4–5 (ESV)

⁴ **But God**, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, ⁵ even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—

Ephesians 2:12 (ESV)

¹² remember that you were at that time separated from Christ, alienated from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world.

Ephesians 2:13 (ESV)

¹³ **But now** in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ.

Romans 3:19–26 (ESV)

¹⁹ Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰ For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

²¹ **But now** the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— ²² the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: ²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. ²⁶ It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

1 John 1:5–9 (ESV)

⁵ This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. ⁶ If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. ⁷ **But** if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. ⁸ If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. **<But...>** ⁹ If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

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Romans 8:1–4 (ESV)

¹ There is **therefore** <But> now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. ² For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. ³ For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴ in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

Illustration: *On August 30, 2005 Coast Guard Lieutenant Iain McConnell was ordered to fly his H46 helicopter to New Orleans and to keep that machine flying around the clock for what would turn out to be a heroic rescue effort. None of his crew were prepared for what they were about to see. They were ahead of every news crew in the nation. The entire city of New Orleans was under water. On their first three missions that day they saved 89 people, three dogs and two cats.*

On the fourth mission, despite twelve different flights to New Orleans, he and his crew were able to save no one. None! They all refused to board the helicopter. Instead they told the Coast Guard to bring them food and water. Yet they were warned that this extremely dangerous. The waters were not going to go away soon. Sadly, many of those people perished because of their refusal to be rescued.
